## **Curriculum Overview**

English

- ★ To accurately read books that are consistent with their phonic knowledge, building up their fluency and confidence.
- ★ To read Year 1 common exception (tricky) words.

- ★ To read and spell words with suffixes s/es, ing, ed, er, est (where no change is needed to the root word) and the prefix un.
- ★ To develop comprehension skills, ensuring children understand what they are reading and are able to answer a range of questions.
- ★ To write from memory dictated sentences using phonic knowledge and common exception words (tricky words).
- ★ To plan and sequence sentences to form a short story.
- ★ To begin to use full stops, question marks and exclamation marks within writing.

#### Maths

- ★ To count to and across 100, forwards and backwards, beginning from any given number.
- ★ To read and write numbers to 100 in numerals.
- ★ To use partitioning knowledge to compare and order numbers, using the language 'more than', 'less than' and 'equal to'.
- ★ Find one more and one less than given numbers or amounts to 100.
- ★ Recognise and know the value of different denominations of coins and notes.
- ★ Recognise and use language relating to dates, including days of the week, weeks, months and years.
- ★ Sequence events in chronological order using language (for example, before and after, next, first, today, yesterday, tomorrow, morning, afternoon and evening).
- ★ Tell the time to the hour and half past the hour and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times.

#### Science

- ★ To observe changes across the four seasons.
- ★ Describe weather and day length associated with the seasons.

Art and Design

★ To use drawings, sketches, paintings and sculptures to share ideas.

#### Computing

- ★ To understand what algorithms are and create and debug simple programs.
- ★ Use logical reasoning to predict the behaviour of simple programs.

#### Design and Technology

★ To plan and create free standing structures based on UK landmarks.

#### Geography

- ★ To name and locate the four countries of the British Isles and their capital cities.
- ★ To develop and use geographical vocabulary.

#### Music

- ★ To explore and understand concepts of pulse and rhythm through songs, rhymes, and games.
- ★ To learn about music notation.
- ★ To learn about different genres of music from around the world.

- ★ To develop bowling, batting and fielding skills using a range of different equipment. To use hand-eye coordination and tracking skills in combination.
- ★ To use tactics and team work in attacking and defending games in order to beat an opponent.

#### PSHE & RSHE

- ★ To learn about healthy relationships, feelings and emotions and value differences.
- ★ To Learn the names for our body parts (including private parts).

RE

★ To explore 'What we can learn from sacred books and stories'.
