Good Morning Parents and Carers,

Our Value for November is Our well-being theme this half term is to learn something new

General Information

Welcome back! We would like to say a huge well done to all of the children for their hard work last half term and hope they are rested and ready for more learning this half term.

Our topic in history this half term is The Great Fire of London. The children will compare London past and present as well as looking at the different jobs people had to do in 1666. They will then learn about the sequence of events of the Great Fire of London and the sources of evidence used by historians, in particular Samuel Pepys diary.

Our main texts in English are Pumpkin Soup and The Night Gardener. The children will write a set of instructions, a character description and an informal letter linked to the story of Pumpkin Soup. For The Night Gardener the children will be thinking about poetry, in particular riddles. They will use ideas from the story to write their own riddle.

We will continue with our group reading sessions 3 times a week where the children explore a different book each week in an adult led group. The children will also continue with their daily phonics lessons following the Little Wandle content for year 2.

Homework

The homework expectations remain the same for this half term:

Reading

The children should be reading a minimum of 3 times a week and their reading record needs to be signed and dated each time they read. Please ensure your child brings their reading book and reading record into school each day. You also have access to the ECollins books which the children read during their group reading sessions. These are updated weekly. This half term additional reward systems are being put in place to recognise those children who are reading regularly at home. Children will 'earn'

house points and raffle tickets depending on the number of times that they have read at home each week and will then be entered into a prize draw each half term.

Spellings

The children will continue to bring their spelling folder home every Friday with a list of spellings to practise based on the spelling words they have been taught in their phonics sessions.

MyMaths

One maths task will be set each week for the children to complete online. Please ensure your child is only completing the task that is set as it will be linked to the maths work they have been working on in school.

All children are expected to complete the weekly homework tasks which are set on a Friday and due on the following Friday. Class teachers will continue to monitor the homework tasks and follow up if the tasks are not completed. If there are any issues with completing any of the tasks then please speak to your child's class teacher.
