Reading

It is extremely important that your child reads at least 3 times a week at home, but preferably more. Reading is the key to life and it impacts heavily on other curriculum areas. Please ensure that each time your child reads, the book title and page numbers read are recorded in their Reading Record and signed by you in acknowledgement. Only reading entries that have an adult signature will count towards the minimum 3 times a week requirement. We will commence with issuing raffle tickets and housepoints for the children who are reading more than 3 times a week.

Reading out loud is an important skill in itself, which helps to improve fluency; therefore please do take opportunities to listen to your child read, asking them questions to develop their understanding.

Times Tables

A reminder that in June of this year, the children will take a multiplication check, which is an online test of their times tables recall. Please encourage your child to regularly practise their tables at home in order to support the work that we are doing in school.

Curriculum Overview

English

- ★ Measure and find equivalent lengths (mm, cm, m, km)
- ★ Find perimeters of rectangles and other polygons.

Science

- ★ To identify and name substances / materials as a solid, liquid or gas
- ★ To use scientific vocabulary to explain the properties of a solid, liquid and gas
- ★ To observe when materials change state
- ★ To explain the water cycle, using the scientific concepts of evaporation and condensation Art and Design
 - ★ To experiment with ways in which surface details can be added to drawings (e.g. line depth and colour blending)

- ★ To draw for increasing periods of time, with more attention to detail, and explaining through annotation
- ★ Experiment to achieve variations in tone

- ★ To use maps and atlases effectively to locate Egypt and other areas of importance to the Ancient Egyptians
- ★ To analyse the key features of a river and map the route of the River Nile from its source to its mouth

History

- ★ To use more precise words and phrases relating to the passage of time, in the context of the Ancient Egyptians (e.g. century, BCE and CE, ancient, modern, recent, lifetime, civilisation)
- ★ To study artefacts and use them to study the life of the Ancient Egyptians
- ★ To describe key events and features of the Ancient Egyptian civilisation, including the discovery of the Tomb of Tutankhamun

★ To develop understanding of using the ukulele
