Good Morning Parents and Carers, **Our Value for April is Forgiveness** Our well-being theme this half term is 'mindfulness'

General Information

Welcome back to the Summer term. We hope you had a lovely break and the children are rested and ready for another busy half term.

Our topic for the Summer term is Inspirational People. This half term the children will learn about a range of people who have been inspirational in the areas of nursing, human rights and science.

In Science the children will focus on living things and their habitat. They will learn about habitats in the local area before moving onto polar, ocean, desert and woodland habitats. Towards the end of the half term they will carry out several investigations about microhabitats.

The children will continue to use the Little Wandle Spelling Programme to learn about different spelling rules and how these are applied to root words. Our group reading sessions will also continue 3 times a week where the children focus on vocabulary, expression and comprehension.

Homework

Thank you for your continued support with the homework tasks that the children are set. The expectations remain the same for this half term:

Reading

Every child is expected to read at least 3 times a week at home. Please support your child in achieving this as regular reading is vital for improving fluency and comprehension. Each time your child reads at home please date and sign their reading record. Your child's reading record and reading book needs to be brought into school every day as these are checked daily by the class teacher. The children will continue to be rewarded with house points and raffle tickets depending on the number of times that they read at home each week. At the end of every half term a raffle ticket is drawn from each class and the winner is rewarded with a prize.

Spellings

The children will continue to bring their spelling folder home every Friday with a list of spellings to practise based on the words they have been taught in their spelling sessions. The format will continue with the use of the 'look, say, cover, write, check' method to encourage the children to try and spell each word from memory. They will also have a challenge each week to write two sentences using the spelling words.

MyMaths

One maths task will be set each week for the children to complete online. Please support your child in completing this task at home and ensure your child is only completing the task that is set as it will be linked to the maths work they have been working on in school.

All children are expected to complete the weekly homework tasks which are set on a Friday and due on the following Friday. Class teachers will continue to monitor the homework tasks and follow up if the tasks are not completed. If there are any issues with completing any of the tasks then please speak to your child's class teacher.
